

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

West Salem is committed to the mission of the district which is "Graduation for All". As a learning community, we are proud of the accomplishments our students and staff have achieved this past year. Our students and staff have excelled in the areas of academics, athletics, activities, and in community service inside and outside of the West Salem area. West Salem High School has three goals for the coming school year that will help support students and staff in their work to improve student achievement:

1. Continue to increase the use of student engagement strategies into instructional practices to enhance student achievement.
2. Continue to use our PLC's (Professional Learning Communities) to enhance student achievement.
3. Increase the number of students accessing and being successful in rigorous classes.

This past year West Salem participated in the SBAC assessment for the second year. This assessment was derived from the Common Core Standards, which sets higher expectations for students in the areas of English Language Arts and Math. The following results were reported for the 2015-2016 school year:

80.9% of ALL students met or exceeded in the area of English Language Arts.
31.6% of ALL students met or exceeded in the area of Math.

We, at West Salem High, have high expectations for ALL of our students. This coming year we plan on reducing class size in Language Arts and Math classes in the lower grades to

help support ALL students, provide workshop classes to help strengthen skills, continue to emphasize AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) instructional strategies school-wide. We will commit to encouraging students to take more rigorous classes while at the same time increasing the rigor in all of our classes school-wide. By accomplishing this, we believe we will improve student achievement at West Salem High School for ALL of our students.

As a parent or guardian, you can support our efforts by checking in with your child each day, monitoring his or her homework and progress in completing that homework. Additionally, you can review your child's grades and attendance at any time by accessing ParentVue.

There are a number of ways to get involved at West Salem High School. We would love for you to consider joining one of our outstanding booster clubs (Education Foundation, Academic, Athletics, Music), volunteering in our ASPIRE program, attending student performances, as well as attending the parent conferences in the fall and spring.

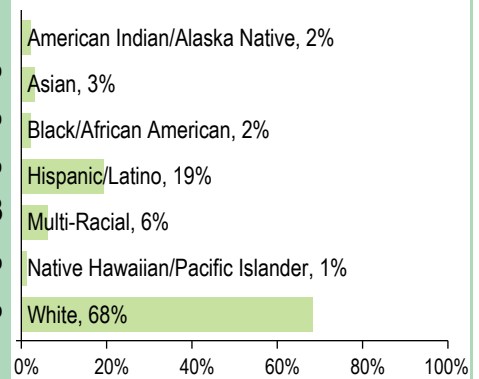

Percent of students without all required vaccines: 3

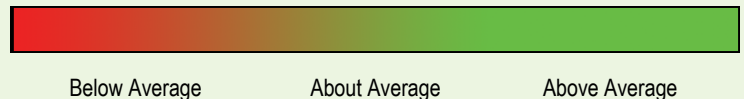
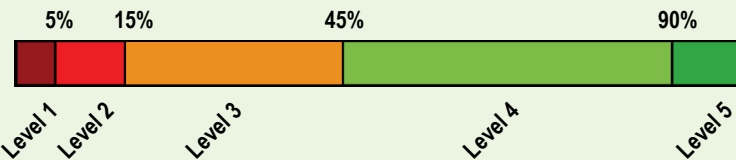
