Tuesday/Thursday – periods 1-4 (90 minutes)
Wednesday/Friday – periods 5-8 (90 minutes)
Two semesters, 18 weeks each, six-week progress grading periods.

Community: West Salem High School is in its seventeenth year of operation and is one of eight high schools in the Salem-Keizer School District. It is a community-based school, serving West Salem. Walker and Straub Middle Schools and five elementary schools feed students into West.

The entire district draws from a population of over 154,000 in the Salem-Keizer metropolitan area, and includes 46 elementary schools, 12 sixth-through-eighth grade middle schools and 8 high schools. There are over 40,000 students in the Salem-Keizer School District. In addition to being the State Capitol of Oregon, Salem lies in the heart of the Willamette Valley, one of the nation's most productive and diversified agricultural regions.

Graduation: 24 units of credit. English (including one credit in writing) – 4; Mathematics – 3; Science – 3; Social Studies – 3; Physical Education – 1; Health – 1; Applied Arts/Fine Arts/Foreign Language – 3; Electives – 6.

Must meet State of Oregon Essential Learning Skills in reading, writing, math and complete a Personal Education Plan (PEP).

Post Secondary: Of the seniors who are on track for graduation, approximately 85% plan to attend post-secondary education with 45% attending a 4-year college or university and 40% attending a community college, technical or vocational school.

Curriculum: West Salem High School, by concrete measures, is carrying out the concepts introduced in the Oregon Education Act for the 21st Century. We have tackled the job of developing a more productive competitive workforce through the advancement of technical education and contextual learning.

Advanced Placement Opportunities: Classes include English Language, U.S. History, Government and Politics, European History, Calculus AB, Statistics, Computer Science, Biology, Chemistry, Spanish Language and Spanish Literature, Art Portfolio, and Seminar, Research.

Honors Opportunities: Classes in Mathematics, English, Science, and Social Studies are offered.

College Credit Now Courses: Students can earn Chemeketa Community College credit through approved courses.

School-to-Work Transition: Programs that strengthen the connections between education and employment are offered in accounting, child development, graphics, business and office occupations, computer science technology, health occupations, emergency medical, fire science, and science research.

Dual Language Program: Students have the opportunity to take dual language coursework and earn the distinction of being a Dual Language Scholar.
